By developing these skills, students acquire specialized vocabulary relevant to the field of economics and social sciences. They gain proficiency in reading English texts and enhance their ability to analyze and interpret complex economic issues. Furthermore, these skills enable students to articulate and defend their viewpoints on matters related to the economic and social world in oral discussions and presentations.
